Foxhunt Report

CFAR 2M Foxhunt Nov 7, 2009 by Tom N9CBA



On the November 2009 CFAR Foxhunt, the fox, Tom N9CBA, hid outdoors in brush. The antenna was a 3-element Yagilaid across bare limbs about 6 ft up and mostly horizontal. The transmitter was on the 25watt setting. The location was near a high power tower south of North Avenue, west of Schmale, and east of Main Pl.
